1. Term 2 Message from Principal

3. Staff Movement

4. Attendance and Punctuality

A gentle reminder that for BGPians to do well in BGPS, there are two important aspects that require your close supervision i.e. your child's attendance and punctuality. We seek the cooperation of parents/guardians to refrain from taking your child/ward out of school during term time. If your child/ward is sick, please ensure that your child/ward gets the required treatment from a doctor as soon as possible. A medical certificate or a parent/guardian's letter is needed to cover the child's absence from school. Disciplinary action may be taken against students for willful absenteeism. In addition, as part of our school's continuing efforts to stay connected and strengthen school-family relationships, Form-Teachers may make home visits to engage parents/guardians for discussions on how to better support your child/ward.

5. Student Attire and Appearance

Students are expected to dress neatly and smartly in clean uniforms and white shoes when they report to school. In addition, fanciful haircuts are not allowed. Please refer to our student handbook page 18, under Code of Conduct.

On days with PE lessons or CCA, students are permitted to wear the school PE attire. This is also applicable to students who come to school outside of curriculum hours including weekends and school holidays. Do note that student name tags must be neatly sewn onto the school shirt and the

PE T-shirt. Parents and students should approach the school bookshop to place an order and pay for the name tags. Please note that skirts must be of knee length and any modification to the school uniform is strictly not allowed. Students in need can approach the General Office for more information on financial assistance for school uniforms.

6. Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) and Consumption of Water

To support BGPians' health education, the school is on board the Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP) by the Health Promotion Board (HPB). This programme provides food service guidelines for school canteens and aims to cultivate good eating habits among BGPians so that they will be accustomed to consuming fruit, vegetables and whole grains as part of their daily diet. Healthy set meals are provided in the school canteen. We seek your support and understanding in this matter as we encourage all BGPians to eat healthily.

We also encourage BGPians to consume water on a regular basis throughout the day as our weather is hot and humid. As proper hydration is important, we strongly encourage all BGPians to bring their own water bottle to school. There are many water coolers around the school for BGPians to fill their water bottles.

7. Curriculum Experience

Curriculum Experience is a special one-day school event, organized every alternate year where all BGPians get to experience learning beyond the confines of a traditional classroom setting. This year, the school will be organizing Curriculum Experience on the last day of the term, 24 May. Previous editions of Curriculum Experience have seen learning activities such as Shadow Theatre, Trampoline Aerobics, Toy Car Dash Challenge, Cotton Ball Launcher, Kirigami, Makersfaire etc, all of which are designed and led by our teachers or supported by our Alumni and passionate parent volunteers who hold the same belief that exposing BGPians to such creative learning experiences can help ignite their curiosity, promote critical thinking and encourage them to discover new learning. Similarly for this year, we will be inviting parents and alumni to support and contribute to the event. 8. Class Photo-Taking

Please be informed that the class photo-taking for all levels will be held on Monday, 15 April, and Tuesday, 16 April. The class photograph will be taken in a group format. BGPians must be in school uniform for their class photo-taking session. The school will provide further details on the class schedule for the photo taking at a later date.

9. Photography and Videography at School Events and Publication of Students' Work

Photographs or video images of BGPians or their parents/legal guardians may be taken during school activities and events such as classroom lessons, CCA, school camps, or school concerts. The school may use and publish such photographs or video recordings in school publications, the school website, social media channels, or other communication channels. If parents do not grant consent and have not notified the school in writing, please do so immediately by Term 2 Week 1.

10. Enhanced Visitor Management Protocol

As part of our ongoing commitment to enhance security and ensure the safety of all individuals in the school, we have introduced the enhanced Visitor Management protocol at the guard post at Gate 1 since 19 February. All visitors, including parents and guardians, are required to register their details

at the guard post. This new registration process ensures that at any time, especially in an emergency, the school will be able to immediately track every person on the school grounds, and that no unauthorized persons will be allowed access to the school. As per current practice, all visitors will continue to be issued with a sticker and a wristband. The sticker must be prominently displayed while the visitor is within the school. We understand that this registration may cause a bit of inconvenience, and would like to seek your cooperation and understanding that this process is necessary to maintain a secure environment for our students and staff. Your support in adhering to the new registration process is greatly appreciated.
